

The 100,000 building is being transformed into a hotel, restaurant, banquet facility, apartment, and retail destination. Mr. Hinzman helped to secure 20 grants totaling \$4.9 million to assist with environmental cleanup and development of site amenities. Work on the project began in 2009 with a scheduled completion date in 2022.
